
WHAT ARE VALUES?


- Values are culturally and emotionally informed beliefs about desirable and appropriate actions for judging appropriate actions and goals.
- Forest values (McFarlane & Boxall, 1999):
 - "general beliefs in relation to forests";
 - "represent an individual's orientation toward forests";
 - "relatively enduring conceptions of the good related to forests and forest ecosystems" (Bengston, 1994).



Theory/theories can help to do this. 3. Although values are difficult to change, understanding them is critical as they influence attitudes and ultimately behaviours (but not the only influence).
